Welcome and Agenda Review

Mrs. McFadzen welcomed everyone to the meeting, and introduced the new members.

There were no changes or omissions to the May 7, 2020 minutes.

Coordinator's Report (including Youth Revolution)

Ms. McGuire-Holder's report is attached. Mrs. McFadzen commented that she is always inspired about what the students come up with under Ms. McGuire-Holder's guidance; continuing to think of the community during this time.

Mayor Chrest noted that with the changing times in not being able to attend YR events, he appreciates that YR has continued with different projects. If there is any way he is able to participate in events virtually he would be happy to do so.

Chief Balcaen said he is happy to participate in events any way he can as well. He congratulated the School Division and Ms. McGuire-Holder for keeping YR going, as it is a great way for students to continue to connect during difficult times.

Partner Updates

Addictions Foundation of Manitoba

- Have recruited and filled all youth-based school counsellor positions and the Enhanced School Based Mental Health and Addictions Initiative position. Counsellors are happy to be back in the schools
- Parkwood is offering in-person counselling again with an option for online counselling where still preferred
- AFM website has free webinars for the public
- Community groups at Parkwood are still suspended due to space limitations aren't able to social distance
- It was asked if Narcotics Anonymous and Alcoholics Anonymous were still going on through the pandemic. It is believed that these groups are meeting virtually. Community members can check the website for updated meeting dates

Brandon Police Service

- A number of different plans have been implemented due to COVID-19 such as housing arrestees instead of just being a detention center as previous. A temporary detention facility is being built on the Brandon Police Service property. A number of staff have been seconded to guard duty because of this, including the High School Resource Officer. This has not affected the front line service. It is hoped by early 2021 all services will be restored with additional staff being put into place
- The Station encourages people to do services by telephone again where possible
- School Resource Officer has helped organize school patrols for those schools who wanted to implement them. School presentations are being done. The number of presentations will be less as presentations need to be done for smaller cohorts of students

 Brandon Police Service is a large part of Community Mobilization Westman, which was also affected by COVID. The Committee was not able to hold in-person meetings at the start of COVID and were corresponding by email and virtual meetings where possible. Gift cards, phones, phone minutes have been purchased through the group for community members who needed them

Brandon School Division

- Brandon School Division is one of three Divisions chosen for the Enhanced School Based Mental Health and Addictions Initiative. Brandon School Division has hired a High-Fidelity Wrap Around Program Facilitator. The Child and Adolescent Treatment Centre have hired a psychiatric nurse. The three partners (Brandon School Division, Child and Adolescent Treatment Centre and Addictions Foundation Manitoba) will work with students and their families who require higher level support. Child and Adolescent Treatment Centre and Addictions Foundation Manitoba's positions will be twelve months, which means students will have support through the summer as well. The team has met with all school leaders, clinicians, school counselors and resource teachers. Referrals will start to be accepted by the team on November 1, 2020
- Trustee Fallis said that she is appreciates and is proud of all the work that is being done to make things better for our youth

Crocus Plains Regional Secondary School

• Mr. Cobbe thanked everyone for the "healthy distractions" that keep students busy during the time of COVID so that students continue to have healthy activities to fill their time

École secondaire Neelin High School

• Ms. Gilleshammer commented on the work that is being done by their Student Council, athletic activities, etc. that allow the students some sense of normal

Vincent Massey High School

- All of the sports teams are running as normal, which is a testament to the staff who want to ensure that the students are staying busy
- The timing of the Enhanced School Based Mental Health and Addictions Initiative is good in helping to support students

Prairie Hope School

- Prairie Hope had a presentation to the students on positive community engagement. This is so important for the students at this time
- Mrs. McFadzen spoke to the work that Prairie Hope High School does with Brightscapes Endeavours

George Fitton School

• Excited for the start of the Enhanced School Based Mental Health and Addictions Initiative as well

- Received the Community Schools Grant last year will be using some of these funds to support mental health
- Discussed a concern for families who are new to the community and haven't registered

Child and Family Services

- Has been difficult to engage youth due to COVID
- Teen Talk will be running out of Virden
- Will be accepting items for the Christmas Store so that children can come to the store to purchase items for family members for Christmas
- Still running Safe and Together Families program

City of Brandon

- The NEO Not Even Once campaign was started a few years ago. The City was planning to do another round of NEO last spring which was cancelled due to COVID
- His Worship commended everyone for their inventive ideas to keep things running as normal as we can
- The City is trying to keep as many recreational activities going as possible, especially outdoor activities

Prairie Mountain Health

- Staff are being encouraged to provide as many virtual services as possible referrals, intakes, etc.
- Testing sites are being organized and delivered by Prairie Mountain Health services, so other duties are being shuffled as required
- Other epidemics are on the rise as well with the pandemic. It was noted that some people are not taking care of their own personal health due to fear of the pandemic

Probation Services

- Still running the drug treatment court weekly in Brandon. A community member enters court, works through a program, and then after the program would get their sentencing
- Will be starting a Restorative Justice System in the Westman Region
- Almost all programs have been suspended at this time. They are looking to open some adult programs with limited numbers
- Working through feelings of isolation with the clients. Cell phones were given to clients and staff so that work could be done from home
- Back to having fifty percent staff in office
- Continuing to work with the John Howard Society

Theme: *We are all connected together*


- New theme/moto (student choice) We are all connected together

- YR @ home projects (similar to May and June) will still be available. Allows students to participate in projects from or at home. Individual students can also be supported in their personalized choice project.

Highlighted YR Projects

Projects are focused on (virtual) community connections, positive school climate, student engagement, increased self esteem and creating positivity.
