Board of Trustees >>> Focus of the Board & Community Engagement

October began with an unique event hosted by the Brandon Teachers' Association Executive at Earl Oxford School. The "Home Economics" teacher, (aka: Red Seal Chef), Lani Parker provided a learning experience for all by presenting lesson plans and preparing a delicious meal replicating skills taught by her for her students.

In addition to the two regular Board Meetings on October 10 and 23, a wide variety of community connections were made including a joint meeting with City Council. The audited 2016-2017 Financial Report was presented and accepted at our October 23 meeting while plans for the 2018-2019 school year have already begun. On October 17 trustees met with Parent Council representatives to seek input on budget and will continue to meet with several other stakeholders.

Other community meetings included the BSD Aboriginal Committee at which Dr. Casavant shared details regarding the process of ongoing assessments and interventions to ensure success for all students. The Friends of Education Committee received updates of the generous donations from community members and organizations many of which were designated for academic

scholarships and awards as well as addressing the replacing of playgrounds. Three very informative consultations took place regarding the Grade 7 and 8 Options Programming Review. We appreciate the reflections of our community in all of these endeavours.

While the annual LIFT Conference on October 20 hosted hundreds of educators from throughout the province as well as the Brandon teachers, the trustees attended the Manitoba School Boards Association Regional meeting to discuss a plethora of issues that impact schools today.

As we move into the details of November, trustees have been invited to several schools to recognize Remembrance Day. We also note that this is the month for Student/Parent/Teacher Interviews and report cards. We encourage you to attend these valuable opportunities to become apprised of your child's status in many areas of their development with academic progress being a prime focus.

Continuous Improvement in Brandon School Division >>>

Brandon School Division is committed to providing Professional Development to our staff to support our Continuous Improvement Plan.

During the 2016-2017 School Year, we examined the factors impacting the school calendar. Representatives from Senior Administration, School Leaders (K-8 and 9-12), and Presidents from BTA & CUPE Local 737 reviewed and considered factors including: provincial exams, semester balance, parent teacher interviews, professional development needs, parent concerns, and legislative and provincial requirements.

In support of our new Continuous Improvement Plan, the 2017-2018 School Calendar was designed to:

- Reduce costs for the delivery of professional development;
- Increase alignment of calendars between K-8 and 9-12;
- Change 3 full-day professional development days to 6 half-days;
- Provide a platform to better respond to new Continuous Improvement
 Framework focused on improving student achievement; and
- Comply fully with Legislation & Provincial requirements.

During the 2016-2017 school year, a consultant was hired to review our current Middle Years Options Programming. A report has been submitted to Senior Administration for review and it is now time to engage with our stakeholders to determine the direction we want for our Middle Years Options Programming.

Students in our Division are suggesting and stating that they would like to see more program options for themselves. School Leaders are also stating that they would like to see more program options being held in the schools in which students attend, rather than having students transported to other locations.
