IAA is a program in which Indigenous

throughout the year to measure
improvement in literacy, numeracy,
attendance and graduation rates.

• <u>Building Students Success with</u> Indigenous Parents

BSSIP is an initiative that supports students' success through engagement of Indigenous parents, community and organizations. The schools involved are in Kindergarten to Grade Eight level.

The Brandon School Division supports services that include – Speech Language Therapy, Audiology Services, Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy through the Brandon Children's Therapy Team. These services are provided to three daycares, two of which are operated by Indigenous support agencies.



INDIGENOUS STUDENT SERVICES

Indigenous Education Learning Specialist
 The Indigenous Education Learning Specialist works directly with administrators and teachers to develop an understanding of the needs of Indigenous students and with the integration of Indigenous culture, values, and history throughout Provincial curricula.

Indigenous Cultural/Elder Advisor

The Elder plays a vital role in creating a culturally appropriate and affirming environment by providing guidance to students and encouraging them to participate in activities and teachings.

The Elder provides cultural perspectives and advice to school staff regarding interaction with students and their families.

• Indigenous Studies Courses

Indigenous Studies are offered at the Grade7/8 and High School level. These studies are open to all students to bring an awareness of Indigenous culture and to foster a greater understanding of both traditional and contemporary issues.
