Canadian Centre for Child Protection

The Canadian Centre for Child Protection is a registered charity dedicated to the personal safety of all children. First incorporated in 1985 as Child Find Manitoba, the CCCP is a group of dedicated volunteers who provide essential services to the families of missing children.

Commit to Kids

The Commit to Kids Program is a step-by-step plan to help child-serving organizations reduce the risk of sexual abuse and create safer environments for the children in their care.

Cybertip!ca

Cybertip!ca is operated by the Canadian Centre for Child Protection. Cybertip!ca's mandate is to protect children from online sexual exploitation.

Kids Help Phone

Kids Help Phone is Canada's only toll-free, 24-hour, bilingual and anonymous phone counselling, referral and Internet service for children and youth. Every day, professional counsellors provide immediate, caring support to young people in urban and rural communities across the country.

Kids in the Know

Kids in the Know is a national interactive safety education program for increasing the personal safety of children and reducing the risk of victimization online and in the real world.

Missingkids.ca

Missingkids.ca offers families support in finding their missing child and provides educational materials to help prevent children from going missing.

PREVNet

PREVNet is a national network of leading researchers and organizations, working together to stop bullying in Canada. It is the first of its kind in this country and a world leader in bullying prevention. Through education, research, training and policy change, PREVNet aims to stop the violence caused by bullying - so every child can grow up happy, healthy and safe.

RCMP – Centre for Youth Crime Prevention

The Centre for Youth Crime Prevention (CYCP) provides Canadians with evidence-informed and age appropriate crime prevention messages, information, tools, and programs to prevent youth crime and victimization.

By working with partners across Canada to provide factual information, the CYCP aims to help communities motivate youth to:

- think critically;
- build skills that support positive decision making; and
- make changes in their lives and communities.

Safe Schools Manitoba

Safe Schools Manitoba is a partnership initiative of organizations committed to working together to enhance the safety of Manitoba's schools. It aims to create a greater awareness and understanding of the problems that impact school safety. Safe Schools Manitoba advocates a positive, proactive approach to the promotion of safe and caring schools and communities.
