## Maryland Park Principal Report Wednesday, December 8, 2021



- Students and staff are working on our first annual musical production, entitled The Magic of the Season, to celebrate the upcoming holiday season. The students will have the opportunity to view the video of the whole concert virtually. We will send home a video of the class performance to families via SeeSaw the week of December 20, 2021.
- We will be hosting our first Hot Lunch Day on Tuesday, December 21, 2021. We are ordering from Pizza Pizza and picking up drinks from a grocery store. Everything will come labelled and in containers. If there are any parent volunteers that would be willing to come and give us a hand to sort and deliver, we would be happy to have you come and help! We will look at offering more Hot Lunch Days after Christmas break. The prices are higher given rising food costs, the need to have everything individually wrapped, and we want to make a profit on each lunch.
- Our virtual Remembrance Day service was amazing! Each class viewed the service virtually, and then, one student from each class laid a wreath at the cross located in the main foyer. We were able to maintain physical distancing, and the students participated in an important event.
- Several of our classes are participating in the Scientist in School program that is based out of Ontario. One class was able to dissect owl pellets to support their learning as they explored food chains. Other classes explored Strong Structures, Amazing Forces, and Get it in Gear. All of these explorations were hands-on and led by a STEM facilitator from this organization. They shipped all the materials to us in individual student bags for the activities. This was a great virtual exploration opportunity!
- Ms. Askham has indicated that she will be returning half-time afternoons beginning January 6, 2022. Mr. Nigli will remain in the classroom on a half-time basis in the mornings.
- Several of our early years classes will be starting the Learn Not to Burn program that is sponsored by the Brandon Fire Department in January.
