Maryland Park Principal Report Wednesday, October 13, 2021



- A traffic reminder went in the September newsletter. Patrol training has taken place for our students in grades 5/6, and training will take place on Monday for our grade 7/8 students who expressed an interest in demonstrating this type of leadership within our school community. We are very appreciative of the job these students do to support the safe crossing of our students in the morning and after school.
- Picture re-take day is scheduled for October 18, 2021. Proofs have been made available to families online, and orders will be done online as well. Feedback on the quality of the proofs you have seen?
- SeeSaw Family This is the app that parents need to be checking for information from their child's teacher and communications from the school. We will be using this communication platform at the classroom and school level frequently. The SeeSaw Classroom App is the app your child should be using to engage in learning tasks. This app is not intended for parents to view. It is designed to be for student use only.
- We have followed up with Prairie Rubber regarding the cost of adding the additional rubber pour around the spinner. The cost is approximately \$5 500.00, and it can be done in the spring of 2022.
- The basketball nets and kid-size nets are supposed to arrive by the end of the month, and we are hoping to install the basketball nets this year (weather depended). The kid's nets are mobile, so placing them when they come should work at the end of the month. The stationary goalposts may be delayed until next year. Materials are challenging to acquire due to COVID.
- Students in grades 7 and 8 are being invited to participate in extra-curricular volleyball skill development. We will be hosting practices at the school, and the MP teams will be playing against one another at least once per week. We are just waiting for a schedule from our Physical Education Team. This will be an opportunity for students interested in further developing their skills outside of their regular physical education time and get extra time in the gym! As a school team, we have decided to focus on in-house practices and games to keep our cohorts within our school, given the current context.
- We will be participating in the Terry Fox Walk as a school. Each class will have a designated time to do the walk. Students have been asked to bring a loonie or a twoonie to donate to cancer research. Our walk is scheduled to take place on October 14, 2021. If we encounter inclement weather, we will move to plan B.
- If families are in need of a Christmas Cheer hamper, they can contact the school and speak with Lisa Ji or Kelly walker to get the forms to complete. The school can support families to complete these forms and get them into Christmas Cheer.
- We are continuing to collect drink can tabs for wheelchairs. The students can hand them into their teachers, and we will give them to Westman Scrap Metals to support this charity. If you can collect them at home and send them to school, that would be greatly appreciated!
- The curriculum overviews that contain the foundational outcomes in each curriculum area will come home at the end of this week or early next week. They will also be posted on SeeSaw and make available on our school website early next week.
- We were provided with additional staffing that was targeted to our Kindergarten area and we created an additional afternoon class, which transitioned on Tuesday, October 12, 2021.
