It is the expectation of the Division that information and communication technologies are to be used in a responsible, efficient, ethical and legal manner in accordance with the Mission, Vision, Values and Continuous Improvement Plan of the Division.

The Division supports the development of Literacy with Information and Communication Technology (LwICT) in students. This means thinking critically and creatively about information and about communication as citizens of the global community, while using ICT safely, responsibly and ethically. It is the responsibility of all staff and students to ensure that technology and communication tools are used to support curricular outcomes in a safe and appropriate manner. To that end, all users will learn to:

- evaluate the accuracy of information available online.
