Hello Maryland Park School Community! We have had a busy few months at school! Student patrols have been trained to support students while crossing the walking path and the street. It takes everyone using this space to ensure safety for all. If you see a traffic violation, please make note of the license plate, details of the incident, and report it to the office.

#### If a Child Exhibits Symptoms While at School Direction from Public Health

Parents will be notified to come and pick up their child immediately if a child reports feeling ill at school. Families need to ensure that they provide the school with current contact information and have a plan to come and pick up their child upon receiving a call that their child is ill. Please remember to pre-screen your child each morning and do not send them to school if they are feeling ill.

A child who has gone home ill can return to the school once it has been determined that it is safe to do so by their health care provider or a public health official and they have been symptom-free for 24 hours. COVID-19 testing will be at the recommendation of Public Health or your healthcare provider. If that child has a positive test, further direction will be provided by public health officials. Public health officials typically follow up with contacts of cases within 24 to 48 hours of receipt of the laboratory report. Close contact isolation is at the direction of Manitoba Public Health.

#### SeeSaw Family and SeeSaw Classroom

Our school is using SeeSaw as a communication tool, as well as a learning tool. Parents need to download SeeSaw Family to see messages from their classroom teacher and information sent by the school. Students need to download Seesaw Classroom in order to complete the learning tasks assigned by their teachers for practice and/or enrichment. It is important that families are using Classroom Family and students are using SeeSaw Classroom, as the apps are intended for different purposes. Students can use SeeSaw Classroom to complete must-do or may-do tasks while we are engaged in at school learning and it will also be a useful learning tool if a classroom had to go to a remote learning period as well. Please download both apps, if you have not done so already, and get connected to your classroom and our school through SeeSaw Family.

#### **Inclement Weather**

As the leaves fall to the ground and the air chills, it is time to dig out our fall and winter gear! Students will be expected to enjoy the great outdoors on the playground during our three recesses throughout the day unless it is raining or is  $-27^{\circ}$  C or colder (combined temperature and windchill). Therefore, it is important that our students dress for the weather. Students must have a pair of indoor runners at school to wear in the school and in the gym. Everyone who enters our building is expected to take off their shoes upon entering. Please label your child's belongings, so if they get misplaced we are able to get the items back in the hands of their owners. Thank you for talking with your child about the importance of wearing their outdoor clothing outside at recess.

While we appreciate getting to know our families and working collaboratively with you to support your child's education, we need to limit the visitors to our building due COVID-19. We ask that you call to set up an appointment with us in advance where possible.
